- · Diabetics are at a higher risk of foot ulceration
- Foot ulcerations in diabetics are long lasting and commonly lead to lower limb amputations
- Therapeutic shoes help prevent the incidence of diabetic foot ulceration and thereby can reduce amputations
- In 1993 Congress passed the Therapeutic Shoe bill to prevent increasing numbers of diabetic amputations and foot ulcerations. It states that when a patient has proper documentation that they are diabetic and qualify for shoes and insoles, depending on their diagnosis, they are eligible to receive one of the following within one (1) calendar year:
 - One (1) pair of off-the-shelf depth shoes and three (3) additional pairs of molded multi-density insoles
 - One (1) pair of off-the-shelf depth shoes including modification and one (1) additional pair of molded multi-density insoles
